## **Faculty Opportunities**

### **1. Application to be a Faculty-led Project with the CUNY Service Corps Opens**

The CUNY Service Corps is inviting City Tech faculty members to engage students to work on service-oriented projects for the 2016-17 academic year. The faculty application **deadline is March 25, 2016**. If faculty members have projects that will provide meaningful work experiences for students, please apply now! Meaningful work experiences can include: conducting source-point tests and collecting samples (air, water, and soil) in residential and commercial settings; enrolling in a Housing and Community Problem Solving Internship course on campus and participating in an action-based research project; planning lessons and activities in an after school seminar for high school students; and participating in research-at the campus, including conducting literature reviews, transcribing interviews and class audio-recordings, writing field notes, and managing the data for the project. Faculty-led projects should seek to impact the short and long-term civic, economic or environmental sustainability of New York City and its residents and communities.

#### **Important facts about faculty-led service projects:**

- Priority will be given to projects that will enable Corps members to obtain academic credit, either through an existing course, an independent study, or some other arrangement.
- Each faculty-led service project should involve a minimum of 3 Corps members.
- Corps members are committed to work for a period of 24 weeks (over the fall and spring semesters) for 12 hours per week.
- Faculty supervisors do not have to be based at one of the eight participating CUNY colleges; Corps members are expected to commute to the faculty supervisor's home college for project-related work.
- Corps members will be matched to the faculty-led project; no grants will be provided directly to the selected faculty-led project.
- It is advised that faculty-led projects be affiliated with a non-profit organization that can provide support and guidance.
