The nominees should submit the following documentation:

1. Nominees' statement on their scholarship and its impact (one-typed page, 12 pt. font size, maximum)
2. **A current curriculum vitae** indicating:
 - Education
 - Employment history
 - Scholarly achievements and accomplishments
 - Teaching and service achievements and accomplishments
 - Academic titles and awards, if any
 - Research interests and area of expertise
 - Research collaborations
 - Grant awards and related achievements and accomplishments. Include title, funding agency, award amount, grant number, time period and role
 - Editorial work
3. **List of publications and other scholarly accomplishments**, in chronological order, the most recent first
Include in your publications and other scholarly accomplishments:
 - Published books – please provide either electronic copies or drop off hard copies in the Provost's Office
 - Copies of published papers in refereed journals.
 - Copies of papers published in the Proceedings of Conferences.
 - Evidence of exhibitions or performances.
 - Other evidence of scholarly work

Please use the following format:

Example:

Smith K.A. (co-authors, if any) "Elastic scattering of high-energy electrons". Journal of Modern Physics, Vol. 4, pp. 89-95. 2001.

Smith K.A. (co-authors, if any) "Experiments in Physics," Third Ed. McGraw-Hill, 156 pages, 2001.

Smith K.A. (co-authors, if any) "Elastic scattering of high-energy electrons" – Proceeding of the 10th National Meeting of American Association of Physics Teachers, Austin, Texas, January 11-15, 2004.
